An exploration of painting with acrylic paints and mixed media.

Acrylic paints lend themselves to mixed media by virtue of the flexibility to use them as you would any other painting material. We will play with different surfaces, add nature, collage, and textured with mark making and more. Start collecting materials that you would like to play with in your mixed media painting. There are no wrong materials!

- Acrylic Paints-I personally am addicted to Golden Artist Paints. They are pure pigment no fillers. Why is that important? The hue is
 true, you can use a medium to extend them without losing intensity. But any good acrylics will work. (Avoid craft paints they have
 lots of filler)
